

THE NEXT FRUITFUL LIBRARIES

This guide is designed to help you decide which library in your district to transform into a Fruitful Library. We've selected the top two candidates in each district based on community need, accessibility, and potential for impact.

A **Fruitful Library** is a public library with an outdoor space transformed into an **Earth Hub**: a vibrant, and regenerative low-maintenance garden that grows fresh food, supports pollinators, and brings people together. By applying permaculture principles, these spaces fight food insecurity, climate change, and social isolation, all while enhancing the role of libraries as trusted, multi-use community hubs. This is in Support the **Library Transition Plan**, an initiative led by Commissioner Ted Terry to transform all 23 libraries in DeKalb County into these regenerative Earth Hubs.

Why Embry Hills?


